

Activity Type

Vocabulary, Grammar and Pronunciation
Activity: word search, gap-fill, changing word forms, pronunciation practice, guessing (pair work)

Focus

Past simple regular verbs
-ed pronunciation
Interesting facts

Aim

To complete interesting facts with past simple regular verbs from a word search and to play a true or false game using the facts.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two worksheets for each pair of students.

Level

Intermediate (B1)

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

In this past simple regular verbs activity, students complete interesting facts with the past form of regular verbs from a word search and play a true or false game using the facts.

Procedure

Divide the students into two groups (A and B).

Give each student a corresponding worksheet.

First, students find the past form of the ten regular verbs in a word search.

Students then complete true or false facts with the past simple verbs.

Afterwards, check the answers with each group and review the -ed sound of each verb.

Next, students pair up with someone from the other group.

Students then take it in turns to read the interesting facts to their partner, paying close attention to the pronunciation of the -ed sounds.

Their partner tries to guess if each fact is true or false.

For each correct guess, students score a point.

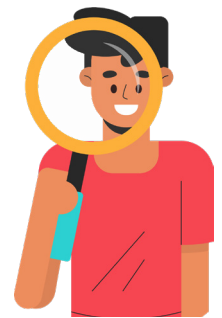
The student with the most points at the end of the game wins.

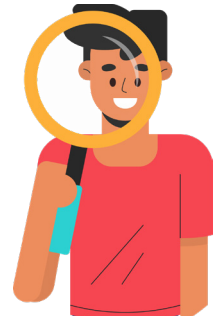
